Notice is hereby given that the Township Clerk of the Township of Monroe will receive sealed proposals (as per 40A:11-4.1 et seq.) for:

MONROE TOWNSHIP FIRE DISTRICT CONSOLIDATION STUDY

SEALED PROPOSALS WILL BE OPENED AND READ IN PUBLIC FOR CONSIDERATION BY the Township of Monroe in the Council Chambers at 1 Municipal Plaza on **THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 30, 2010 at 3:30 p.m.** prevailing time. All sealed proposals from vendors and or contractors will be accepted at the time of Proposal Opening only when called by the Township Clerk.

Instructions to Vendors, Request for Proposal Documents may be examined by prospective vendors during business hours at the Office of the Monroe Township Clerk at the Municipal Complex on 1 Municipal Plaza, Monroe Township New Jersey or examined and/or secured by prospective bidders between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. prevailing time at the Office of the Township Clerk, Monroe Township New Jersey until forty-eight (48) hours prior to the time set for the opening of Proposals. Proposal Documents may be secured by prospective vendors upon receipt of a check made payable to Monroe Township in the amount of **\$25.00** for one (1) set of documents which fee shall be **NON-REFUNDABLE.**

Each proposal must be accompanied by a Certified Check, Cashier's Check or Bid Bond at the Bidder's discretion for \$500 payable to the Township of Monroe, New Jersey

Three copies of the proposal must be enclosed in a sealed envelope bearing the name and address of the vendor and labeled:

Bidders are required to comply with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 (P.L. 1975, C.127).

The Township reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, to waive any informality, or to accept the proposal that, in its judgment, best serves the interest of the Township.

The Township may hold proposals for a period of sixty (60) days from the date of the receipt of proposals for the purpose of reviewing the proposals and investigating the qualifications of the vendors, prior to awarding of the contract.
